
Where to buy...

The Week reviews an exhibition in a private gallery

Priscilla Mouritzen, Riitta Talonpoika, and Annie Turner

at Galerie Besson

For collectors who are strapped for cash, the best bargains are to be found in the ceramics market. You'd be unlikely to find artworks anywhere else of comparable

quality, originality and technical finesse to works shown here by these three artists.

Priscilla Mouritzen (b.1945) is from Denmark and makes smoke-fired, porcelain pinch-pots which look like exotic seed-pods that you might find washed up on some desert-island beach. Riitta Talonpoika (b.1961) is from Finland. Her slab-built minimalist cubes and blocks, pierced with different grid patterns, with subtly variegated smoky textures work as a wall-hung group just as well as free-standing single pieces. Annie Turner (b.1958) shows a series called *River Ladders*, which

are elegant sculptures with salt-corroded surfaces and drifting, twisting shapes that seem almost airborne with their own energy. There is also a group of bluish-white bowls shaped like mussel

shells. Prices range between £100 and £950.
